Sir Nick Faldo Charity Dinner A Golfing Legend Visits the HKFC

n the evening of 16th March 2015, the Golf Society and the Club as a whole were honoured to host the legendary British six times Major winning golfer, Sir Nick Faldo, for a dinner and charity fund raiser in the Restaurant.

When I showed him round prior to the start of the evening, Nick was impressed by the quality and range of sporting facilities and activities in the Club as well as our unique setting intertwined with Happy Valley Racecourse.

Nick had just arrived in Hong Kong the previous day from Vietnam and Cambodia where he was inspecting some golf courses which he was designing. He was due to depart the following afternoon for Mission Hills in Shenzhen in China, were he would be hosting the Faldo Series finals on the Faldo designed course there. But, before doing so Nick played with four of us in the Faldo Five Ball and hosted a two hour golf clinic for another lucky eight at the Hong Kong Golf Club.

Our Club has been honoured by visits and performances from some of the greatest rugby, soccer, squash, hockey and bowls players. But we have only had the privilege of welcoming one other multiple Major winning golfer, who said of Nick "He had a work ethic that was quite unbelievable."

Coming from a man as driven as Gary Player, the only man from outside the USA to win more Majors than Nick, this is quite an accolade!

Nick's golfing achievements are nothing short of remarkable, especially when you consider that he only started playing at 13 after watching the Golden Bear, Jack Nicklaus in the US Masters. Only four years later, aged 17, Nick won the English Amateur and British Youth Championships.

In 1977, Nick turned pro, won his first tournament, came 8th in the European Order of Merit and appeared in the first of no less than 11 consecutive European Ryder Cup teams, all by the ripe old age of 20!

From there, he went on to become the most successful European golfer since the start of the First World War in 1914 when Harry Vardon won the last of his seven Majors.

Nick won three Open Claret Jugs and three Masters Green Jackets, and over 40 professional tournaments in total, as well as more Ryder Cup points than any other golfer has ever done on either side of the Atlantic. As a result, he was ranked as the No.1 Golfer in the World for no less than 97 weeks.

Nick's achievements are testament to not only his special golfing talent but also his personal drive, determination, dedication and hard work to maximize his potential.

According to former PGA chief executive, Sandy Jones, "it is his dedication and commitment that really

set him apart." This along with an ability to remain composed under pressure, avoid mistakes and intimidate opponents proved to be a recipe for his outstanding success.

While Nick is most famous for his stellar golfing playing achievements, he is also interested in many other aspects of the game, including golf club design, apparel, course design, commentary and last but by no means least the Faldo Series.

After hosting the golf events at Fanling on the 17th, Nick headed up to Mission Hills to host the Faldo Series Asia Grand Final event on the Faldo Golf Course from 18 to 20 March 2015. There, five of Hong Kong's best young golfers, including Leon d'Souza from this Club, competed against others from around the region.

Nick founded the Faldo Series in 1996 to give something back to the sport he loves by providing opportunities to young male and female golfers under the age of 21 from around the world. This Series has grown into some 40 annual tournaments in over 30 countries in which over 7,000 youngsters participate each year.

Notable graduates include current Mens' World No. 1 Rory McILroy of Northern Ireland and former Ladies No. 1 Yani Tseng from Taiwan. Who knows, in the future, the Series may help one of Hong Kong's young golfers break through to the highest level in golf.

Sir Nick was knighted by Queen Elizabeth in November 2009 for his contributions and service to golf. He is the only living British golfer to receive such an honour.

So, as a token of our appreciation to Nick for taking the time to be with us, we organized the evening as a fund raising event.

Following a pleasant cocktail and an excellent dinner, Nick was invited to speak by Fergus McCoig who kindly "volunteered" for the job of MC at short notice.

Nick began by telling us a bit about the Faldo Series before participating in a Q&A session. After answering some of the many questions submitted by the audience in advance of the evening, Nick threw the session open to the floor and fielded everyone's questions with both







insight and humour, thereby creating a convivial atmosphere which we all enjoyed greatly.

Nick then assisted Fergus to conduct the auction of the fabulous prizes donated by Nick. These included two tickets to the US Masters, sets of signed and framed pictures of all of Nick's Major triumphs, opportunities for four of us to play in a Faldo Five Ball and for eight of us to pick up golfing tips in a golf clinic at the Hong Kong Golf Club on the following day.

The Society has now donated all of the net proceeds of HK\$350,000 to the Faldo Series, for which Nick has given us his sincere thanks.

Nick was genuinely touched by the tremendous reception he received in Hong Kong from us. Moreover, Nick was charming, engaging with everyone present and always willing to pose for photographs and sign autographs. In doing so, he provided memorable moments to many people.

The evening ended with an exchange of gifts by Nick to the Golf Society of a beautiful framed selection of great signed pictures capturing his six Golf Major winning moments and by the Society to Nick of HKFC mementos.

The Golf Society wishes to thank Mission Hills our presentation partner in this event, without which it would not have been possible. We also thank Mission Hills for donating a four ball golf weekend package for auction as well as goodie bags containing golf hats and shirts for all attendees.

In addition, we thank the Hong Kong Golf Club for its support in providing us with the venue for the five ball and golf clinic events with Nick at Fanling on Tuesday 17th March 2015.

We thank all of those people who bid for and won the fabulous auction prizes donated by Nick. We also thank everyone who contributed donations to the lucky draw.

But of course our Society's greatest thanks go to the legendary sportsman, Sir Nick Faldo himself for providing us with this wonderful opportunity.

Finally, the Chairman of the Society, Ian Petersen, wishes to thank Committee Members Darren McEntee and Dallas Reid, Event Organiser Phil Head, MC Fergus McCoig, photographer Laura Simonsen, as well as Winki Ho and the rest of the Restaurant and back office team for helping to make this event such a success.
